Teacher Notes

The quiz consists of 15 questions about Northern Ireland in the 1920s.

There are also useful links within the quiz that might provide ideas for further pupil activities.

You can use this quiz alongside other CCEA Northern Ireland @ 100 resources. For example, you could use the quiz after showing the Living in Northern Ireland in the 1920s PowerPoint – or at another suitable point in your teaching.

Audience: Key Stage 2 and Key Stage 3 Pupils

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| Prior Learning (at an appropriate level to match the Key Stage and Year of pupils) | Pupils may have some prior knowledge and understanding of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> the history of Northern Ireland in the 1920s; how Northern Ireland has changed over the past 100 years; the significance of the year 2021 as Northern Ireland's Centenary year; and diversity, inclusion and respect. |
| Learning Outcomes | Pupils will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> demonstrate knowledge and understanding about living in Northern Ireland in the 1920s; and clearly express their views and opinions. |

Examples of opportunities for developing Communication Skills, Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities

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| Communication Skills | Pupils will have opportunities to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> listen to and take part in discussions; communicate information, ideas, opinions and feelings; and explore ideas, events and features in texts. |
| Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities | Pupils will have opportunities to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> justify methods, opinions and conclusions; make new connections between information; and give and respond to feedback. |
| Social and Emotional Learning Competencies | Pupils will have opportunities to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> identify and recognise others' emotions and feelings; and understand and show empathy and compassion for others. |
